



# SPRING FITNESS CLASSES



Proactive Adult: An active class for those who want to keep moving with choreographed cardio patterns followed by free weights and mat work. Designed to promote muscle awareness and improve muscle tone. Balance exercises are a must. The choreography is alternated with interval workouts to keep the routine fresh every week! Instructor: Judi

Fusion Fitness: A blended class that incorporates posture and exercises from Yoga, Pilates and strength training. This mat-based course provides participants with all the best aspects of yoga, pilates and strength training for an exceptionally well-rounded class that challenges even the most expert yogi and pilates guru. This low impact class improves participants' strength, flexibility and balance. Participants are encouraged to bring their own yoga mat. Instructor: Judi

Strength and Core: This class focuses on building strength in both the upper and lower body. Working with different counts as we lift weights. There will be a cardio interval (no choreography), followed by core work on the floor and stretches. Open to all levels. You choose the weight you want to use. Instructor Judi

**Seniors Yoga** – Classes will focus on gentle stretching, breathing exercises and meditation. It does not matter how flexible we are as long as we keep moving and do what we can. Instructor: Marcy

Improver Line Dance – This class is suitable for our more advanced dancers. We will add to the basic step patterns and choreography will include a variety of tempos and rhythms. At this level the dance routines will have several turns and will often have restarts and tags. The choreography is typically 32-64 and involve several turns.

High Beginner/Beginner Plus Line Dance This beginner plus class if for those people who have taken the beginner class. There will be more turns and new step combinations to master. You are able to easily remember the basic dance steps and able to do most of the dances by memory.

**Beginner Line Dance** – There is no experience required for this class. Basic line dance steps and terminology will be taught. Wear supportive, comfortable shoes that have a smooth sole and comfortable clothing.

**Relaxation Yoga** - This class will get your body moving in ways that are supportive. You will notice your breathing become calmer and we will also include mindfulness practices that can be used in your daily life. Open to all levels and abilities. Instructor: Taryn

# The SSCA would like to bring to your attention the City of Calgary's Proposal for City-Wide Rezoning\*

A public hearing date has been set for April 22, 2024. This is when City of Calgary Administration will present a recommended approach to city-wide rezoning to Council. The public may attend the public hearing in person or submit written input. ## **Details Related to the City-Wide Rezoning**

- The majority of properties in Silver Springs are zoned R-C1 allowing one house on one residential lot (plus an option for a secondary suite) and a relatively small number of R-C2 lots allowing two houses on one lot (plus an option for secondary suites).
- The rezoning proposal would change the base zoning from R-C1 and R-C2 to R-CG allowing for single detached, semi-detached, row houses and townhouses. Most standard lots could have up to a four units townhouse and each townhouse unit may also contain a secondary suite. This means that on a standard lot there could be a total of eight units.
- Existing R-CG parking requirements are 0.5 stalls/unit and 0.5 stalls/suite. Parking requirements for suites will be removed with the new proposed rezoning.
- R-CG zoning has two other major changes: lot coverage and height
- Lot coverage An R-C1 house can cover a maximum of 45% of the lot whereas R-CG row house or townhouse units can cover up to 60% of the lot.
- Height An R-C1 house can be either 8.6 meters height (contextual development permit) or maximum 10 meters high (discretionary development permit). A rezoned R-CG can be 11 meters high, an additional 3+ feet in height.
- R-CG rezoning would apply to every R-C1 and R-C2 (duplex) property in Calgary.
- Development permit applications will still be required.
- The date for the Public Hearing is April 22, 2024.
- Council will vote on this rezoning proposal.



# HAYLEY'S RINK **OUTDOOR ICE NEWS**

An arctic vortex sporting temperatures below -30C, drove all outdoor enthusiasts to seek the comfort of indoor activities, began to fade by January 15th allowing our volunteer rink maintenance crews to remove snow and restore the four rinks to prime winter skating conditions.

Taking advantage of the ideal skating conditions in mid-January, the St. Sylvester Elementary School hosted a 3 day skate-a-thon at the Silver Springs Community Rinks. Similar to their skate-a-thons in the previous 3 years, students from kindergarten to Grade 6 marched from their school to the rinks in organized groups to enjoy outdoor fun on the rinks with their friends and classmates. With skills sets from beginner to accomplished skaters, students set individual goals to accomplish during their daily 45-minute sessions over the three-day event and helped each other learn and/or improve their skating ability. Teachers and parent volunteers along with the students thoroughly enjoy these skatea-thons which create lasting memories for all these young skaters! A shout out goes to all involved who made this year's skate-a-thon such a success!

The rinks once again flourished through to late January when skaters enjoyed what was to be a +40C swing in temperature from the just a few weeks earlier. However, with prudent ice maintenance practices and a solidly frozen base from the weeks of extreme cold, the ice surfaces survived several days of +10C highs almost through to the end of the month.

Double digit high temperatures the first week in February turned the rinks to slush for several days giving some young skaters concern that this was an early end to this year's outdoor skating season. However, seasonal norm temperatures returned on February 6th and with daily floods and maintenance, all the rinks were restored to prime winter skating conditions by Valentines Day!



Seed Starting 101 by Jennifer Hoglin (Gooseberry Gardens)

Although it is still too cold outside to start digging in the dirt, now is the perfect time to get some seeds started indoors. This talk will cover everything seed starting so that we are ready to transfer those baby plants outdoors (once it has warmed up, of course). We will look at:

- why we need to start some of our seeds early,
- what equipment you need (and don't need),
- when each plant needs to be started, and
- a step by step illustration of the process.

Satisfy that gardening itch by getting a head start on your summer garden now!

# **Garden Planning**

March is a wonderful time to start thinking about your garden for the upcoming season. If you took notes last year, review them now to refresh your memory about what worked well and what you would do differently. If you didn't, it's never too late to start a garden journal!

Find your seeds from last year and check them. Make a list of ones you are running low on. Consider which plants you like best, and which ones have been most successful for you. I also like to use this as an opportunity to reflect on if there are any plants that haven't worked well for me that I will "give up on" this year. I set those seeds aside and share them with other gardeners who might have better luck or conditions for them. It's important to consider our hardiness zone and first and last frost dates when planning for which plants to grow, and when to grow them.

One helpful resource is the planting charts developed by <u>West Coast Seeds</u> but there are many more online.

# SENIORS CORNER

A speaker series on the Companion Program-Living with Advanced Illness was held Wednesday Feb.28. This is a Calgary hospice family-centered and community based program to help improve the quality of life for those impacted by any advanced illness. Wendy Kerr, the Living with Advanced Illness Program Coordinator and Ruth Kohut, Director of Hospice Calgary, presented the 3 services that Hospice Calgary offers.

- 1. Rosedale Hospice a 7 bed hospice providing end-of-life care to adults with cancer as an alternative to hospitalization or dying at home. Their interprofessional health care team cares for patients and their family members in a supportive environment that focuses on quality time with family and friends.
- 2. Children's Grief Center for children 19 yrs of age and under that need support and counseling for the loss of a loved one.
- 3. Living with Advanced Illness- a service that matches individuals and families with volunteers to provide a connection with people, resources and services in their community to maintain a good quality of life. They offer weekly visits with the goal to reduce stress and feelings of isolation in individuals and caregivers and their families during advanced illness. The main focus is on companionship and practical support. Some examples of advanced illnesses would be Parkinson's Disease, Dementia, ALS, Cancer, Heart Disease, Advanced Kidney Disease, COPD.

I attended a play in late January that was presented by the Seniors Acting Lab Society (SALS) called Old Mule. It was about a senior that gets entangled in an internet scam.

After the play, there was a Q & A session with 4 experts regarding fraud prevention. Representatives from the Alberta Securities Commission, the Better Business Bureau, Calgary Police Service and Calgary Seniors Resource Society gave advice on how to stay safe. They would be willing to come to our community and speak about how to protect yourself from being scammed. There was a request for this at the AGM. I wanted to float the idea of an evening session for all community residents, not just seniors.



The **Ukulele Afternoon** will be held Monday March 11 at 1:30 PM in the boardroom. This will be limited to 20-25 people. The cost will be \$35.00. Registration will open on March 1st at 9am online <a href="here">here</a>. It is put on by Honolua Ukuleles, a Calgary-based company that was founded in 2017. They supply the ukuleles and all the tools to teach the group how to play. I am asking that people come dressed Hawaiian. There will be Hawaiian decorations and Hawaiian refreshments. #### AN UPDATE FROM THE OFFICE OF PAT KELLY

Parliament resumed on January 29th, and I have been busy in Ottawa holding the Liberal government to account for its actions.

Canadians are struggling with rising mortgage payments and rent, as well the increasing cost of home as heating, gas, and food, yet the Liberal government will increase the Carbon Tax April 1st. Excessive on government spending, borrowing and taxes lead to inflation. I will continue opposing the wasteful spending, deficits and higher taxes that drive up the cost of living.

I am a member of the Standing Committee on National Defence, and regularly question Canada's Senior Military Officers, bureaucrats, industry experts, academics, and the Minister of Defence. The Committee heard that there is a crisis of recruitment and retention in the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF). There 16,000 are 10,000 personnel vacancies and personnel are undertrained and unfit for deployment.

In response to an "Order Paper Question" from my office, the Liberal government confirmed that it typically takes more than six months just to process a recruitment application, and members are leaving the CAF faster they are joining. We also than received testimony that virtually every of heavy category equipment, including ships, aircraft, tanks, satellites, and missile defence systems urgently need to be replaced, and that ammunition supplies are critically low and not being replaced.

In January of this year, I hosted a public Open House at my Constituency Office. Thank you everyone who took the time to attend and share your concerns with me. Feedback from Calgarians is very important to me and informs the work I do on your behalf in Ottawa. # **Budget 2024**

We began sitting for the Spring 2024 Session of the Legislature on February 28, 2024, and the government introduced the 2024 Alberta budget.

As Official Opposition Health Critic, I will be taking a lead role in scrutinizing the health budget. To prepare for this, I'm consulting with healthcare experts, frontline workers across the province, and everyday Albertans trying to access healthcare. In this budget, I will be looking for a long-term, evidence-based plan that makes the most effective use of money to recruit and retain health care workers, and to improve access and quality of care.

We cannot effectively increase spaces to care with people without enough staff. We must immediately focus on retention of our workforce. We cannot let the system crumble further.

#### **Town Halls**

On February 24th, I hosted a "Your Pension Is Yours" town hall, to give constituents such as yourself a chance to share your thoughts on changes to the CPP. It remains clear that the vast majority of Albertans just do not want Alberta to leave the CPP, nor do they want politicians having control over their hard-earned retirement money.

On Thursday March 21st, I will be hosting a Health Care Town Hall in Parkdale, with an open house from 2:00-4:00PM, and a town hall at 6:00PM. With government health care reforms looming, and the system crumbling, there needs to be a serious refocus of the reforms to support frontline workers. I want to hear from the health care workers, the people who have been affected by this crisis, and you. # **Drought conditions**

Last summer was dry, and it has been another dry winter for the most part. In order to protect our ecosystems and drinking water supply, The City may once again need to put water restrictions in place this spring. Taking steps year-round to reduce water consumption can help reduce the impact of drought and reduce the need for restrictions. Learn more at calgary.ca/droughtresilience.

# **Blanket rezoning**

On April 22, Councill will hold a public hearing on changing the zoning of singlefamily properties across the city to the "R-CG" district. This would allow the construction of townhouses or duplexes on most residential properties in Calgary individual without hearing before an Council.
