Pool Opens: June 10 2024 Last Day of the Season: September 2 2024 Updates for Summer 2024

Private Pool Rentals, Swim Lessons and Private Swim Lessons - all registrations and reservations will be **online** only. Reservations cannot be taken by phone or in person.

You can book all of your children in a swimming lesson in one transaction! Our new registration system allows you to purchase multiple swim lessons at the same time. Once a lesson is in your shopping cart, your selection will be held for 15 minutes.

- COSPA has a new cancellation policy for swim lessons. To ensure more equitable access to swim lessons, lessons must be paid for at the time of registration. Swim lessons are not refundable or transferable.
- Private pool rental reservations will be limited to one rental per family. Rentals are are not refundable or transferable.
- \$6 flat rate pricing for pool admission provides a 90-minute swim time for ages 2 and up. Children under 2 may enter at no cost.

Swimming Lesson Level Description

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life- Preschool 1:

Preschoolers will learn to enter and exit shallow water safely, put their faces in the water and blow bubbles. Becoming comfortable with floats and back glides, they will move safely in shallow water and wear lifejackets. Recommended ages: 3-5 years.

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life- Preschool 2:

Preschoolers will jump into chest deep water, learn to submerge and exhale underwater. They will be introduced to rollovers, front and back glides. They will also practice flutter kicks wearing a lifejacket or other buoyant aid. Swim for Life - Preschool 1 is a prerequisite. Recommended age: 3-5 years.

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life- Preschool 3:

Preschoolers will perform various entries into deep water wearing a lifejacket. They will retrieve objects from the bottom in waist deep water and master independent front and back floats, lateral rollovers, front and back glides and front and back flutter kicks. Swim for Life - Preschool 2 is a prerequisite. Recommended age: 3-5 years.

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life- Preschool 4:

Preschoolers will learn to swim independently while mastering front crawls swims of 5m and be introduced to side glides and the side flutter kick. They'll face new challenges like opening their eyes underwater, rollovers onto the back and treading water using the sculling action. Swim for Life - Preschool 3 is a prerequisite. Recommended age: 3-5 years.

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life- Preschool 5:

Preschoolers will support themselves in deep water for 10 seconds using the sculling action. Wearing a lifejacket, they'll practice forward roll entries into deep water, whip kicks, back crawl and interval training. Graduates can start Swimmer 2 at 6 years of age. Swim for Life - Preschool 4 is a prerequisite. Recommended age: 3-5 years.

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life-Swimmer 1:

This is the foundation for swimming skill development. Swimmers learn safe entries into various depths of water, treading water, breath control, opening eyes under the water, front and back floats, lateral rollovers, front, back and side glides, flutter kick on front and back, and front crawl. Recommended ages: 6-17 years.

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life-Swimmer 2:

Swimmers will learn different entries into deep water wearing a lifejacket and interval training will be introduced at this level. Other swimming skills include flutter kick; back and side, whip kick, distance swims, front and back crawl. Prerequisite: Swim for Life - Swimmer 1 or Preschool 5. Recommended ages: 6-17 years.

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life-Swimmer 3:

Swimmers will practice kneeling dives, forward rolls into deep water, handstands and front somersaults in water. They'll also work on front crawl, back crawl, whip kick on their back, and interval training. Swim for Life - Swimmer 2 is a prerequisite. Recommended Ages: 6-17 years.

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life-Swimmer 4:

New skills include standing dives into deep water, underwater swims of 5m include, whip kicks on front and breaststroke arm drills. The Swim to Survive standards will be included: roll entry into deep water, treading water for one minute, swimming 50m - skills to survive a fall into deep water. Swim for Life - Swimmer 3 is a prerequisite. Recommended Ages: 6-17 years.

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life-Swimmer 5:

Shallow dives and tuck jumps (cannonball) are the new entries introduced at this level. Swimmers will master back somersaults in the water, stationary eggbeater kick, head up front crawl and breaststroke. Interval training and sprints for front and back crawl are the fitness components. Swim for Life - Swimmer 4 is a prerequisite. Recommended Ages: 6-17 years.

Swimming Lesson Level Description

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life-Swimmer 6:

Swimmers learn deep water stride entry and compact jumps. They'll tread water with legs only, use lifesaving eggbeater and scissor kicks, accomplish a 300m workout with front crawl, back crawl and/or breaststroke. Graduates are prepared for the Canadian Swim Patrol awards. Swim for Life - Swimmer 5 is a prerequisite. Recommended Ages: 6-17 years.

Lifesaving Society-Rookie Patrol

Develops individual fitness levels to meet a timed 100m swim and 350m workout. Water proficiency skills include: swims with clothes, ready position, foot-first and head-first surface dives. Demonstrating an ability to conduct a primary assessment and initiating EMS are included as first aid skills. Victim recognition and throwing assists are other key elements of the program.

Lifesaving Society- Ranger Patrol

Enhances capability in the water, including stride entry, underwater forward and backward somersaults, lifesaving eggbeater kick and increased fitness levels to meet a 200m timed swim. Rescue skills involve an increased skill level in first aid basics, victim recognition and non-contact rescues. Successful completion of Rookie Patrol is a pre-requisite.

Lifesaving Society- Star Patrol

An excellent preparation for the Bronze Star award, Star Patrol demands good physical conditioning and lifesaving judgment. Participants develop lifesaving and first aid skills; further refine front crawl, back crawl and breaststroke (100m each); and complete 600m workouts and for 300m timed swims. Successful completion of Ranger Patrol is a pre-requisite.

Lifesaving Society Bronze Star:

The Lifesaving Society's Bronze Star develops swimming proficiency, lifesaving skill, and personal fitness. Candidates refine their stroke mechanics, acquire self-rescue skills, and apply fitness principles in training workouts. Bronze Star is excellent preparation for success in Bronze Medallion and provides a fun introduction to lifesaving sport. Recommended ages: 12+ years.

Lifesaving Society Bronze Medallion:

This 16-hour course challenges the candidate both mentally and physically. Judgement, knowledge, skill, and fitness - the four components of water rescue. Candidates acquire the assessment and problem-solving skills needed to make good decisions in, on, and around the water. Candidates will also be taught CPR for adults, children and infants as well as AED usage. A CPR-C certification will awarded prior to completion. Bronze Medallion is a prerequisite for assistant lifeguard training in Bronze Cross. 100% attendance is required. Pre-requisite(s): 13 years of age (or Bronze Star) and CPR-C (CPR-C is offered within the course and does not have to be done prior.)

Lifesaving Society Bronze Cross:

The 20-hour Lifesaving Society's Bronze Cross begins the transition from lifesaving to lifeguarding and prepares candidates for responsibilities as an assistant lifeguard. Candidates strengthen and expand their lifesaving skills and apply the principles and techniques of active surveillance in aquatic facilities. Bronze Cross emphasized the importance of teamwork and communication in preventing and responding to aquatic emergencies. Bronze Cross is a pre-requisite for advanced training in the Society's National leadership certification Lifeguard and programs. 100% attendance is mandatory. Pre-requisite(s): 13 years of age, Bronze Medallion & Standard First Aid CPR-C & AED.

This year will have two new initiatives. We will be working on a water management program to rationalize our water usage. We will also provide information to the community on water management principles and practice. Watch for this. As well we will be planning a major garden improvement for the South border garden. Sandwich boards are up to describe the upcoming plans. We are also in discussion with the Alberta Regional Lily Society to plan a new Martagon Lily bed within the South Border garden.

Our little library will open on May 1. We have received many donations already, but given the high interest from the community, we are open to receiving more donations if you have any books or magazines with a botanical or horticultural focus. We are hoping to have this library as a resource to the gardening community. Last year our large stock of books was taken out of the library and not returned. Clearly there is huge interest in gardening books. We are looking for more books to restock the library. If you have any to donate, please drop them off at the Community Center in Silver Springs. (Please alert the staff about them and they will alert us. Pick up is weekly on Friday). Please return any books so others can enjoy.

Our educational activities for May and June include the following:

May 13, 10:30 am - A walk to the Alpine Rock and Crevice Garden to meet the gardeners and see the wonderful collection of alpine plants which are both cold and drought tolerant. Designer, Rob Staniland will be at the garden to provide information and answer questions. We ask you to meet at the main entrance near the kiosk. There is no pre registration requirement.

May 15, 7:30 pm – Carol Patterson will be presenting on a "Do it Yourself garden box watering system. This was trialled in our large planters last year and worked well to provide consistent moisture for the annuals in the planters. This course is located in the board room at the Silver Springs Community Center. Preregistration with the community center is required. The cost is \$15.00

June 15, 10:30 am – a walk to explore our variety of trees that grow in our climate will be led by Teresa Lynch. This will require pre registration. Watch for future information on this.

June 19, 7:30 pm – a panel of experts will discuss 'Sustaining your garden during the hot, dry, summer months. This requires pre-registration with the community center and costs \$15.00. It will be located in the board room at the Silver Springs Community Center.

Moose are large and can hurt people or dogs who disturb them. Please keep your dogs on a leash when they are in the vacinity. Avoiding close contact is also advisable. Take your pictures from a distance.

AN UPDATE FROM THE OFFICE OF PAT KELLY

I have been busy in Ottawa holding the government to account for its actions.

This year, the carbon tax went up 23% despite an affordability crisis and persistent inflation. This is the next step in the NDP-Liberal government's plan to quadruple the carbon tax over the next six years, making everything more expensive for everyone.

In April, the Liberals released the 2024 budget. It includes nearly \$40 billion in new inflationary spending. Canada will now spend \$54.1 billion to service Trudeau's debt, which is more money than the federal health care transfer. Struggling families can't afford higher taxes and more inflationary spending that drives up the cost of everything and keeps interest rates high. That is why Conservative leader Pierre Poilievre sent a letter to Justin Trudeau with three demands to fix the budget:

1.Axe the tax on farmers and food by immediately passing Bill C-234 in its original form.

2.Build the homes, not bureaucracy, by requiring cities to permit 15% more home building each year as a condition for receiving federal infrastructure money.

3.Cap the spending with a dollar-for-dollar rule to bring down interest rates and inflation. The government must find a dollar in savings for every new dollar of spending.

Justin Trudeau's budget does not meet any of these conditions, therefore my colleagues and I will vote against it and vote nonconfidence in the government.

Drought update

All events are 10:00-2:00 and each rain barrel is \$78+ GST. This includes the rain barrel, brass tap, outlet cap and adapter. Hose kits are also available for an additional cost.
