Class Descriptions

Ballet - Technically based training with a physiological focus. Builds coordination, balance and core dance skills.

Jazz - Influenced by a fusion of hip hop and ballet principles. Typically upbeat, fast in tempo, and includes a variety of movement types. **Hip Hop** - Street styles including popping, locking, breaking, and house.

Acro/Cheer - Fusion of dance and gymnastics incorporating cheer techniques. Based on teamwork and flexibility.

Musical Theater - Fusion of dancing, singing and acting. Storytelling and characterization is emphasized.

Lyrical/Contemporary - Ballet-based technique with elements of jazz. Creative expression and individualism in dancer artistry.

Dance Variety - Learn to create original choreography and to collaborate with others.

Dance Variety (18+) Dance Foundations

Plus - Whether you are new to dance, an experienced dancer, or a past dancer looking to get back into dance, this 18+ class is a safe space for all adults (no matter the level or experience), to join a stress-free, low-cost community dance class. In this class, a variety of styles can be explored including styles like ballet, jazz, hip hop, contemporary, improv and heels. The styles you wish to work on will be discussed with the instructor during the first class, and the curriculum will be adjusted accordingly, making this tailored and personable class for all participants.

WINTER FITNESS CLASSES



Proactive Adult: An active class for those moving who want to keep choreographed cardio patterns followed by free weights and mat work. Designed promote muscle awareness improve muscle tone. Balance exercises must. The choreography alternated with interval workouts to keep the routine fresh every week!

Strength and Core: This class focuses on building strength in both the upper and lower body. Working with different counts as we lift weights. There will be a cardio interval (no choreography), followed by core work on the floor and stretches. Open to all levels. You choose the weight you want to use. Instructor Judi

Seniors Yoga – Classes will focus on gentle stretching, breathing exercises and meditation. It does not matter how flexible we are as long as we keep moving and do what we can. If this class is full but there is space due to absence, we will allow drop-in's at a rate of \$12. SCENT FREE CLASS Instructor: Marcy

Improver Line Dance – This class is suitable for our more advanced dancers. We will add to the basic step patterns and choreography will include a variety of tempos and rhythms. At this level the dance routines will have several turns and will often have restarts and tags. The choreography is typically 32-64 and involve several turns.

High Beginner/Beginner Plus Line Dance – This beginner plus class if for those people who have taken the beginner class and are ready for more of a challenge. There will be more turns and new step combinations to master. You are ready for this class when you are able to easily remember the basic dance steps that were introduced in the beginner class. You are also able to do most of the dances by memory.

Beginner Line Dance – There is no experience required for this class. Basic line dance steps and terminology will be taught. Wear supportive, comfortable shoes that have a smooth sole and comfortable clothing.



Fall clean up and garden projects

Thanks to all those who came out to prepare the garden for winter on September 28 during our annual Fall Cleanup. Many hands made quick work of the tasks such as pruning back perennial plants, protecting shrubs with chicken wire, raking leaves and putting away the hoses and other seasonal items. 31 gardeners were joined by the Cubs and Scouts, their parents and leaders who gathered leaves (carbon based material) for the compost. At this time of year, we produce more green (nitrogen based plant material) than we can deal with so we are appreciative that the BGSS allows us to take some of our excess plant material to their compost area. Several neighbours came by to assist with our fall cleanup and stayed to socialize following this work. We are very fortunate to have wonderful neighbours who watch over our garden and who come out to assist us in so many ways. We are well set up







In October, we also completed 2 improvement projects at the garden: Adding gravel and terracing the food forest. We received 4 cubic yards of pea gravel from the City of Calgary. Thank you to the volunteers who helped to distribute and rake gravel throughout all the interior garden pathways. This will help minimize weeds an improve overall appearance.

Another huge thank you to the volunteers who helped to edge the perimeter garden beds and terrace the slope on the north side of the food forest. Terracing will prevent erosion from rain and watering.

Over the winter, a planning meeting will be held to discuss the upcoming season and other projects. More information will be communicated when a date is selected.

THE EDIBLE GARDENS OF SILVER SPRINGS

159 Silver Springs Scenic Acres Cubs and Beavers.

For the second consecutive summer, the 159 Silver Springs and Scenic Acres were fortunate enough to have the opportunity to work with our community partners at the Silver Springs Edible Gardens. Our Beavers and Cubs groups were given the fantastic opportunity to work on a garden project and help the Edible Gardens group with some year-end cleanup for the Beavers North Star projects and the Cubs' Seeonee projects, which are top section awards for Beavers and Cubs graduating to Cubs and Scouts. I don't think any of us imagined how challenging a year this was going to be with all of the water restrictions, but having some time to reflect on things, I think the kids did the best they could do with limited resources and lots of hours were contributed to make our project a success!

At the start of our journey in May, Linda Higgins led our crew in getting a "Three Sisters Garden" planted, with squash, beans, and sunflowers, and we also planted vegetables in two garden boxes. Our intrepid gardeners planted kale, spinach, lettuce, carrots, and swiss chard. Kay Wilford also put on a few composting sessions with the kids helping with sifting for a bit of "extra credit." We learned a lot about composting, planting techniques, watering and resilience, and although our production may have been a little modest, I think we learned a lot about how important water is as a resource and how it's something we can't take for granted, and the kids had a great time learning about what it takes to grow food. There is so much to learn, and so many variables. There were great lessons learned and the kids had some great laughs and visits at our planting, composting and cleanup sessions.

We couldn't do any of this without our brilliant partners at the Edible Gardens. Kay Wilford, Linda Higgins, Liz McKay, and ALL of the volunteers were just so incredibly welcoming and helpful, and made this such a fun adventure for the kids.

Preparing your garden for winter

Next season's success starts at the end of this garden season. Here are some easy ways to prepare your garden for the coming winter.

- Add compost to your beds and cover with mulch (straw, leaves etc)
- Mulch your berry bushes
- Water perennial flowers and shrubs
- Cut back perennials. For more information on which perennials to cut back in fall, <u>Fall</u>

- Protect trees, shrubs and roses by circling them with chicken wire and adding mulch inside the wire
- Turn off your outside water, disconnect hoses and empty rain barrels
- Clean and put away pots and other garden items
- Make a list of seeds that you will need for next season
- Write notes about your successes and things you would do differently next year
